


SPAIN BEST CHEF 31 years-old

I can't say that I have one favourite moment here, but I can say that this EVS for me, was and is something important. I learned a lot from the people in this project and I feel that I grow up a lot.


Coline



During November & December 2018 we, the volunteers and the coordinators, worked very hard for The Christmas Campaign. Our goal was to give a Christmas gift to those children who cannot afford it.

For a good teamwork it had to be well organised! We will explain all the steps of our process.

We started promoting the Christmas Campaign (1) in social media and schools. By asking children to bring the toys they do not use anymore (soft toys, plastic toys, books, puzzles, etc.) and give them to the children in Hospitals and Special Schools where they are in difficulties or in disadvantaged.

After we proceed to collect the toys (2). It was the hardest step to transport all the heavy bags full of toys in the tram, taxies and buses from the schools to our office after our lessons.









Sorting all the toys (3) and plush collected in the office was the funniest step, it was like a childhood come back!

After this it was the time to use our math skills, packing the toys in bags (4).

Finally the time has come to give the bags to children in Hospitals (5). The BEST part. It was amazing to see the results of our work and receive smiles and amazed faces from the children!!

Good job guys!!! Now it is time to enjoy, celebrating it with a big party and to take a big deserved rest (6)...






WHAT DO THE **CHILDREN THINK? STUDY BY HENDER!!**





How do you see yourself in 10 years? Me in 10 years mmm, I see myself lost like always.


Coline
